[Healthy Smiles from the Start](#) continues to be the focus of our Dental Health Education. Have you ordered a kit yet? Possibly a Dental School if you have one close to you? Do you have a friend with connections to your State Head Start Program? Perhaps your spouse is involved in your state dental organization and can help you contact the executive director? There are many ways to reach our targeted audience of new mothers, not just through a hospital or birthing center. Be creative in thinking of people to contact and share with us! Healthy Smiles from the Start is currently in 32 states and has gone international!

We have distributed close to 650 kits and have recently reached several international countries such as Mexico, Guatemala, Korea, Honduras, and Cuba!

Do you have a mission trip in your future plans? How about ordering a kit and possibly taking along some infant toothbrushes or Spiffie wipes? The Georgia Dental Association President Dr. Doug Torbush and wife AADA Past President Debbie Torbush, recently traveled to Cuba with 45 dentists, spouses and friends. During a panel discussion with the group and the director and professors of the Dental School, I was able to present Healthy Smiles from the Start to the school. The director's first question was, does this have copy write protection? I was thrilled to say no, this is a free gift for you to share with anyone that will benefit. Georgia Alliance Treasurer Fran Brown delivered 150 safety toothbrushes to the school and Alliance members on the trip randomly passed out toothbrushes to mothers with babies they met along the way. Saving Lives

British philanthropist, Stan Brock is always on the hunt for a new mission. With his recent appearance as a Keynote speaker at the AADA 2015 Conference in Memphis, TN, Brock and his Remote Area Medical Team were definitely prepared for their newest challenge.



With tragic news of the Earthquake in Nepal on April 25th, 2015, Remote Area Medical first responders are on the ground.

Oriane Leake, Volunteer Manager of Remote Area Medical Headquarters says, “This morning, the first team of RAM responders checked in with the Health Department of a town called Bahrabise in the Sindhupalchok District of Nepal, just east of Kathmandu. The assigned villages from the WHO are Piskar and Dhuskun, also in Sindhupalchok. Sindhupalchok was the hardest-hit region of Nepal and is therefore the priority for aid at the moment. The first team’s members include: Mike Whaley, Margaret De Coux, Genell Hilton, Dr. Janice Bach, Dr. Andy Siskind, Paul Khunkhun, Allison, Tse, Jodi Sagorin, Sharon Rynard, Dr. Vasu Malepati, Dr. Durga Malepati, and Jill York. John Stauffer and Julie Peddicord will join tomorrow. Team leader, Paul Maresca, will be in charge of keeping the overall group up to speed. Of course, the team does not know what to expect. The WHO assigned RAM the region due to how little they knew about the area’s damage, essentially sending the team on a reconnaissance mission. There is no way to tell whether the area will be fit as a fiddle with a few buildings torn down and our team will be out in two days, or in much more dire straights with several weeks worth of work. Regardless, I know the people of the area are in good hands with our team down there. I mean just look at that handsome team picture!”
